After School Hours of Operation

3:30 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday

After school all doors are locked at 3:45. If you need to pick your child up before 4:45 you will need to send a note and/or make prior arrangements.

EARLY RISERS 7:15 AM TO 8:30 AM*Grades K-5 / Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday*

Students participating in the morning program will meet in the library. Please come prepared to enjoy a great start to your morning. You will have time to finish your homework, or work on your math, spelling, writing, and reading skills. Students may have an opportunity to work with classroom teachers as well as doing projects and through the use of computers, cards, and academic games.

Students must arrive by 7:30 to participate in Early Risers. The doors are locked and no one will be at the doors from 7:30 to 8:15.

Early Risers will run continuously throughout the school year every day school is in session through May 11th.

LIT BIT 7:30AM TO 8:30AM

This is a teacher recommended program. Students will be notified of placement in this program. Students will be working on literacy under the supervision of a teacher.

CENTRAL STATION Mondays/Tuesdays/Thursdays

Led by Ms Chastity *Grades K-5*

This program offers an opportunity for fun enrichment activities with an environment education theme through crafts, legos, beading, cooking, technology, physical fitness and more.

LITART Mondays/Tuesdays/Thursdays

Led by Ms. Natasha of the Boys and Girls Club *Grades 2-5*

In this program students will be involved in fun activities presented in a game-like environment created to increase reading and writing skills, as well as a love of reading. The students will be working through activities with trained 4th/5th grade students under the supervision of staff from the Boys and Girls Club and Lincoln Elementary School.

ANIMAL ILLUSTRATORS ***Mondays***

Each week the group explores the works of a different children's book illustrator. Students are read a story and discuss the book's illustrations. Inspired by the techniques and materials of the artist, students try their hand at that art technique and make their own illustrations. Some of the illustrators that students become familiar with are Denise Fleming, Eric Carle, Lois Ehlert, Steve Jenkins, and Robert Sabuda.

ARTS AND CRAFTS Available ***Monday/Tuesday/Thursday***

Led by Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Dreikosen ***Grades K-5***

Calling all kids who love to create, cut, color, paint, and just have fun! Here is a chance to explore, make a mess, and have a great time learning! You will be so busy you won't know an hour has passed by!

SELF DEFENSE ***Mondays***

Led by Sylvia Thao ***Grades K-5***

This class is taught by certified instructors from Rising Son Mixed Martial Arts. Students will learn self-control and confidence as well as easy verbal and physical techniques to defend themselves. In addition they will learn how to respond to certain situations and that sometimes just diffusing a situation in a calm and confident manner resolves the problems.

HMONG FUN

Led by Mrs. Pong Thao ***Grades 3-5*** ***A 2-day per week class on Tuesdays and Thursdays***

Join this class if you are interested in learning more about the Hmong culture and traditions through reading , songs, arts, crafts, and writing.

PANDAU

Led by: Ms. Yer Thao ***Grades 2-5*** ***A 2-day per week class on Tuesdays and Thursdays***

Pandau is a form of textile art that incorporates cross-stitching and embroidery techniques often depicting animals, symbols and/or sceneries. Join Ms. Thao to learn this history telling craft and learn more about the heritage of the Hmong people. New projects for new and returning students.

KID POWER (Limited to 35 students)

Led by: Ms. Pergolski ***Grades 3/4/5*** ***A 2-day per week class on Tuesdays and Thursdays***

Fun! Fitness! Technology! UNICEF Kid Power is a program aimed at increasing U.S. children's activity levels by tapping into children's intrinsic desire to do good. Students will wear activity bands provided by the program that are synced to a computer program. Through their activity levels, kids earn points, which unlocks funding from partners of UNICEF that will support treatment for a malnourished child.

YOGA! Tuesdays

Led by: Ms. Jessie Robinson (limit of 15) *Grades 1-5*

Kids! Feel like you want to stretch your body, soothe your mind, and get energized? Just say "om" and enjoy an hour of relaxation and fun! Students will also be keeping a yoga diary to take what they learn each week home to share with the family!

PLAY IT SAFE Tuesdays

Led by: The Women's Community (*Limited to 10 students*) *Grade K-2*

In this program students will be involved in fun activities, stories and games fostered around the topic of being safe. Children will learn alternatives to physical and verbal misbehaviors and learn to express themselves positively and assertively. You will also learn protective behaviors, which will motivate children to think critically and follow their instincts. Overall, this program will promote self-esteem and confidence and do so in a fun and friendly way.

TRASHART- PROJECT RECYCLE ART Thursdays

Led By: Joan from The Neighbors' Place *Grades K-5*

What fun! Upcycling! We will be creating beautiful and creative treasures from recycled trash-recycled jars, cans, and soda bottles. Also we will enjoy working with clay, paints, sand, and chalk.

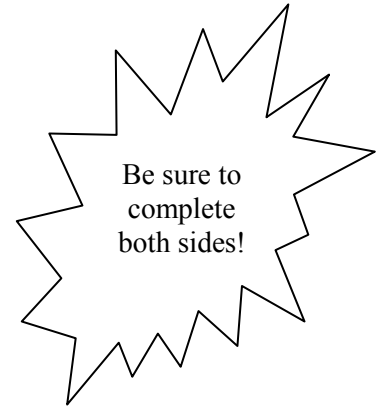
